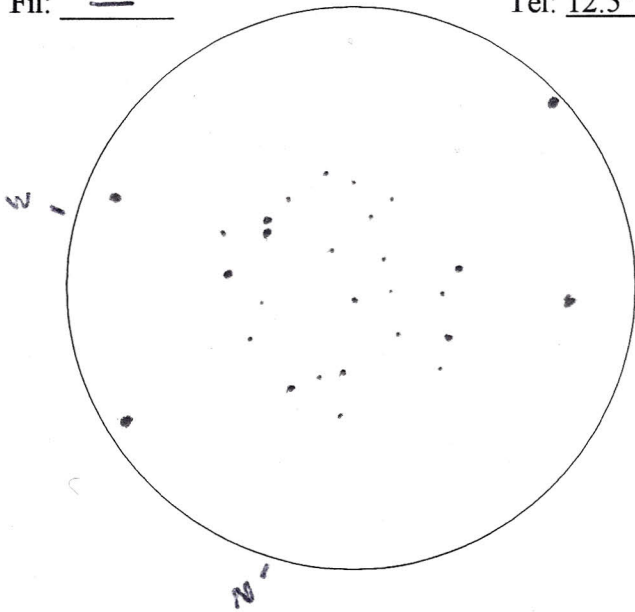
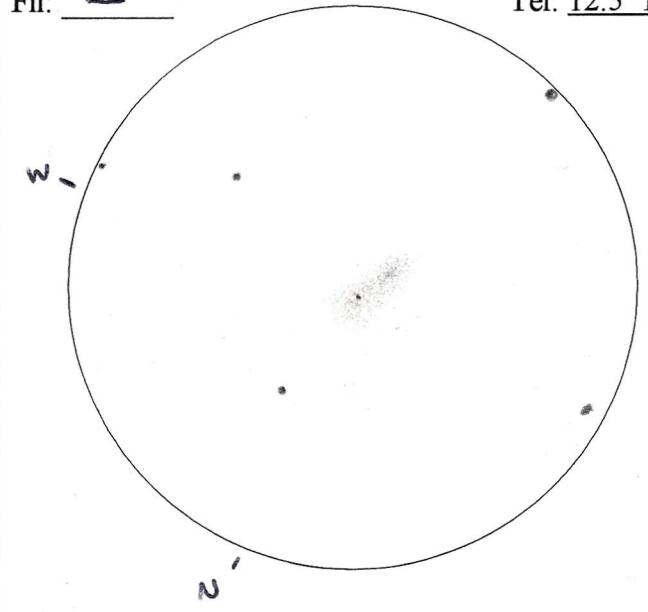

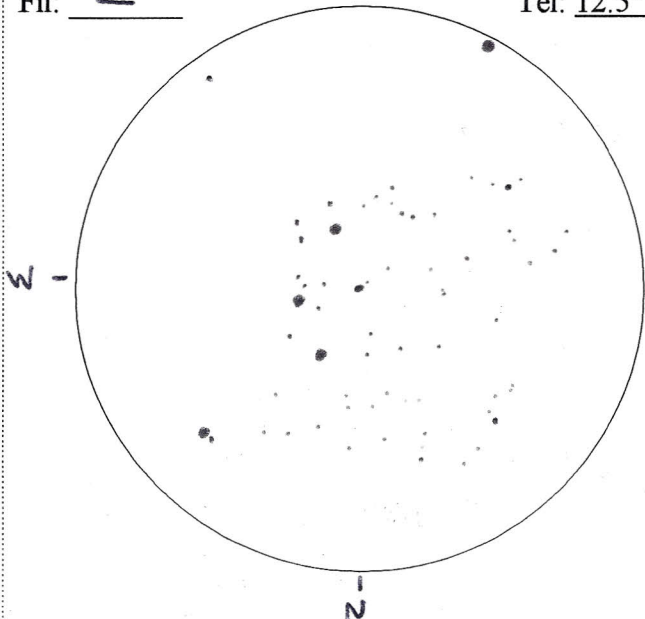
This cluster appears as a concentration of stars within the larger cluster NGC 1746.

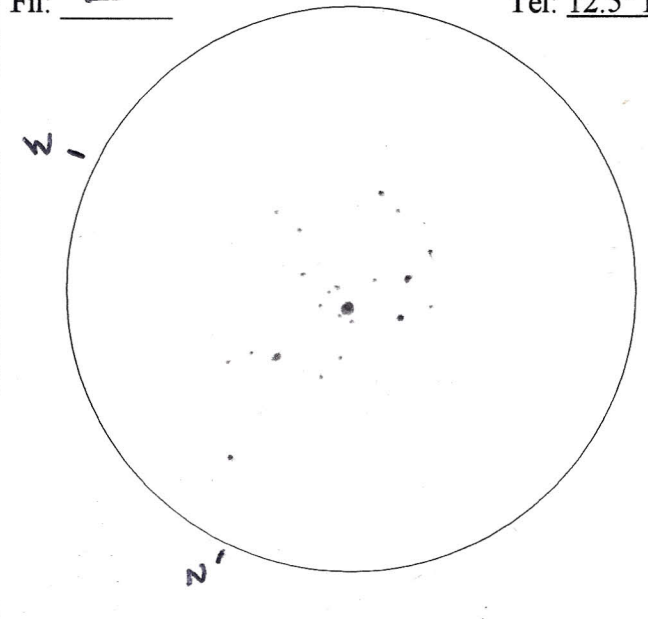
Single 10<sup>th</sup> magnitude star surrounded by very faint glow which extends toward the SSE, with a slight concentration there.
