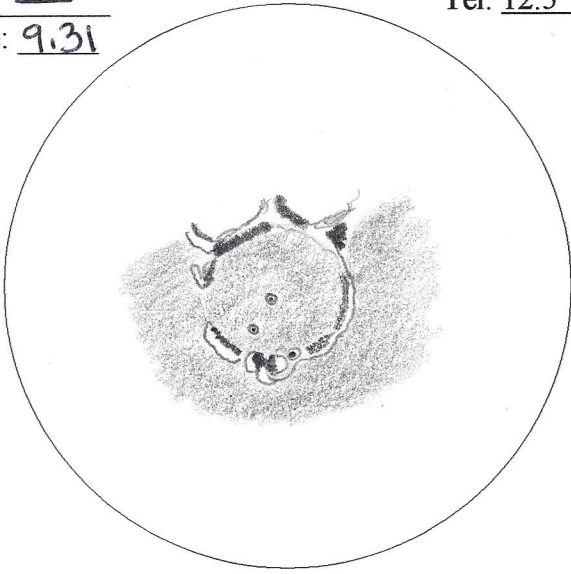
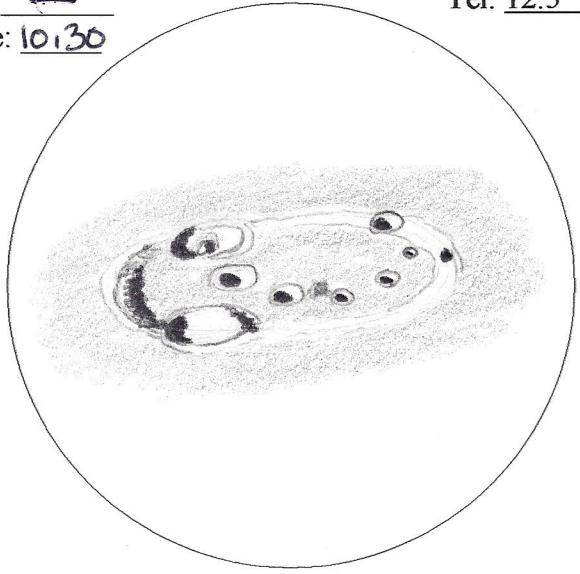

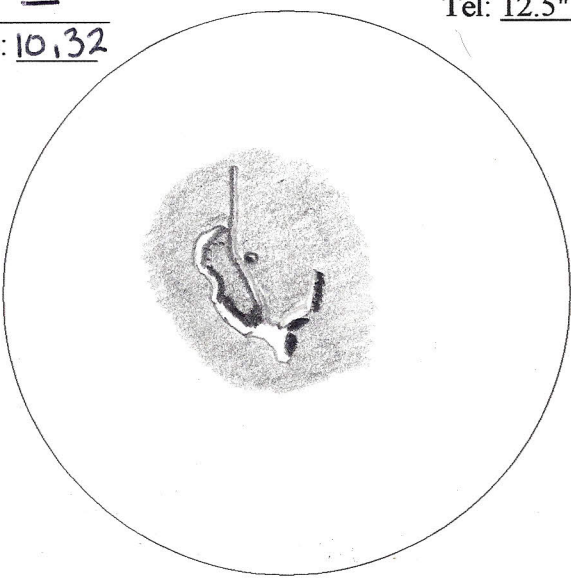
An old, large crater. The eastern wall is completely gone in one spot, irregular rim. Flat floor w/ a few craterlets. No central peak.

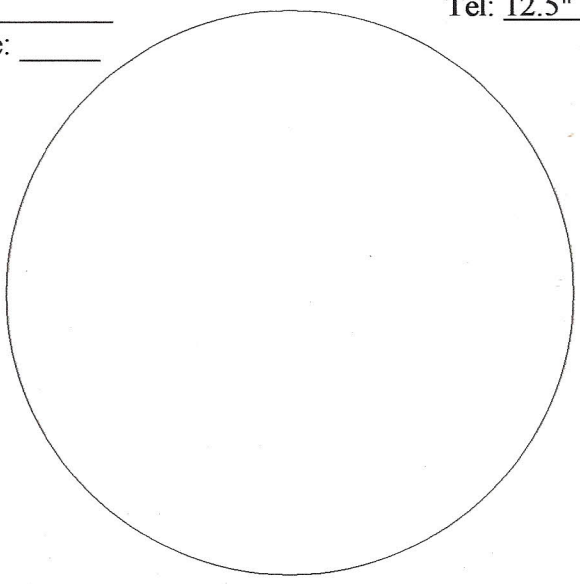
Clavius is an extremely large crater with a flat floor w/ no central peak although there are some low off-center hills. It has a curious chain of craterlets which gradually increase in size from the smallest near the SW rim to the largest on the SE rim (6).
